CHOOSE SUBJECTS YOU ENJOY

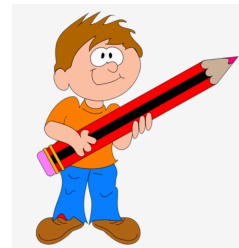
